## Election result provides the platform to tackle productivity and reform

The Corporate Tax Association (CTA) congratulates the Albanese Government on its recent election win and the opportunities a second term with a majority presents.

Australia's tax system is consistently listed as one of the priority areas needing reform.

“We are very much looking forward to working alongside the Government to address the challenges facing Australia. Working alongside business is key to ensuring those challenges are met with policies that work on the ground and truly generate productivity today and tomorrow,” CTA Executive Director Michelle de Niese said.

As the representative of over 160 large businesses operating in Australia, the CTA stands ready to assist the Government in identifying the 'what' and the 'how'.
